*Here's what you need*

*250g Sultanas*

*250g Chopped Raisins*

*250g Currants*

*125g Chopped Mixed Peel*

*90g Chopped Red glace cherries*

*90g Chopped Blanched almonds*

*1/3 Cup Sherry or Brandy*

*250g Plain Flour*

*60g Self raising flour*

*1/4 teaspoon grated nutmeg*

*1/2 teaspoon ground ginger*

*1/2 teaspoon ground cloves*

*250g Butter*

*250g soft brown sugar*

*1/2 teaspoon lemon essence **OR***

*Finely grated lemon rind*

*1/2 teaspoon almond essence*

*1/2 teaspoon vanilla essence*

*4 large eggs*

*Here's what you do*

*Mix together all the fruits and nuts, sprinkle with the sherry or brandy. Cover and leave for at least 1 hour, but preferably overnight.*

*Sift together the flours and spices.*

*Cream together the butter and sugar with the essences.*

*Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition, then alternatively add the fruit and flour mixtures. Mix thoroughly. The mixture should be stiff enough to support a wooden spoon.*

*Place the mixture into a prepared tin, no larger than 20cm square and bake in a slow oven for approximately 3 1/2 - 4 hours.*

*Allow the cake to cool in the tin.*

*Note: To ensure uniformity and depending upon the size, it is suggested the raisins be snipped into 3 or 4 pieces, cherries into 4 – 6 pieces and almonds crosswise into 3 – 4 pieces.*

## **OPEN ROSE CLASSES**

***REGULATIONS FOR EXHIBITING ROSES:***

### **EXHIBITION ROSES**

#### **(Large Flowered/Hybrid Tea)**

Exhibition Roses are shown singly, the presence of a bud or buds attached will disqualify. Wiring is permitted. (e.g. Tineke, Kardinal, Princesse de Monaco, Moonstone, Elina)

They should be round in outline, about 2 thirds open, petal symmetrically arranged around a pointed centre.

### **DECORATIVE ROSES**

#### **(Large Flowered/Hybrid Tea)**

Decorative Roses are Hybrid Teas other than Exhibition types and may be exhibited at any stage. Side buds and blooms are permitted; full blooms should always be fresh (e.g. Queen Elizabeth, Duet, Baronne Edmund de Rothschild).

### **FLORIBUNDA ROSES**

Floribunda Roses should have as many blooms as possible, at all stages. Blooms should always be fresh and any stale blooms should be removed to avoid penalty.

### **BUNCHES**

Bunches of roses are for frontal viewing and are judged for condition, overall beauty, presentation and foliage.

### **BOWLS**

Bowls should be the standard 15cm black plastic florists bowls, and shall contain a miniblock of oasis. Bowl exhibits shall be allowed a space of 30cm overall diameter. Arrangements can contain buds, foliage and hews (if desired), and will be viewed all round. Bowls are judged for condition, overall beauty, presentation and foliage.

- Hobby glue must NOT be used as an attachment medium for sugar work.
